Peru & Bolivia

Travel well off of the beaten path as you walk in the footsteps of Inca emperors and reveal remote Amazonian wonders untouched by the hands of time.







From city to city and region to region, every destination holds a unique appeal. Go where your dreams lead you, with help from these expert recommendations.

Lima

Set on a towering bluff overlooking the Pacific, Lima affords a living, breathing study in diversity. The city's architecture, history and culture span Incan, colonial and contemporary international influences. A mild coastal climate complements Lima's endless variety of attractions — inviting visitors to retrace the steps of the conquistadors, savor a plate of ocean-fresh ceviche and sip an expertly mixed pisco sour.

Cusco & the Sacred Valley

The former Incan capital and Spanish colonial outpost of Cusco sits perched 11,200 feet in the Andes, affording a vibrant urban gateway to the pastoral Sacred Valley that lies below. Cusco beckons visitors to take in its historic Plaza de Armas and splendid cathedral before heading down to explore the valley, a riverside oasis of villages, ruins and farms flanked by terraced Andean mountainsides.

The Amazon Basin

Encompassing the world's largest river and rainforest, the Amazon basin spans nearly 40 percent of the South American continent. Those who cruise its namesake river embark on a legendary journey into a vast and unspoiled ecosystem teeming with dolphins, piranha, toucans and monkeys. The basin is also home to several indigenous tribes, some remaining largely isolated from the outside world.







Uyuni

Set in Bolivia's southwest corner, the desert outpost of Uyuni affords a welcome oasis among the hauntingly beautiful moonscape that surrounds it. The small town is known for its warm, hospitable locals and easy access to the awe-inspiring vastness of the Salar de Uyuni (Uyuni Salt Flats).

La Paz

Nestled across a gaping Andean canyon some 13,000 feet above sea level, La Paz boasts the highest elevation of any capital city in the world. This mountain metropolis welcomes guests to wander its winding lanes, stroll its curious market stalls and take in its colonial architecture.

Lake Titicaca

Lake Titicaca's massive size, eerie stillness and piercing blue hue complement a rich history dating back to the early, pre-Incan hill tribes who still call these shores home. Timeworn cathedrals look out over handharvested fields while towering Andean peaks rise over the horizon.

Machu Picchu Citadel

Overlooking the Urubamba River from its remote Andean perch, this 500-year-old citadel still holds the secret of its passing. Retrace the footsteps of Inca emperors, learning the theories that may one day reveal the truth behind this stunning and mysterious wonder of the world.



Kuelap Fortress

Fascinating Kuelap in Peru's remote Chachapoyas region is a massive stone settlement far less visited than Machu Picchu that is emerging as a destination in its own right. Begun in the fifth century AD, it was built by the "Warriors of the Clouds," whose culture predated the Incas by centuries.




Isla Pescado

Isolated on the windswept barrens of the Uyuni Salt Flats, the oasis of Isla Pescado (Fish Island) rises from the dried-up seabed of this ancient lake. Take in this singularly alien landscape of cacti and rocky outcroppings set against the vast backdrop of the arid salt flats.



Tiwanaku Islands

The ruins of the ancient Tiwanaku culture in western Bolivia have stood for well over 1,600 years. Located, in part, on islands in Lake Titicaca, they include carved statues, temples, astrological gates and imposing walls constructed from huge stones, in the mortarless style of Sacsayhuaman.

Hike or Climb Above Machu Picchu

While exploring Machu Picchu offers you plenty of exercise, there are even bigger challenges close at hand, including a long, slowly inclined hike up to Inti Punku (the Sun Gate) on the ridge overlooking the citadel or the steep trek up towering Huayna Picchu with its bird's-eye view of the area.

Meet the Kallawayas

Consult with the Kallawayas, traditional healers of the Bolivian Andes. These direct descendants of Tiwanaku culture offer blessings and answer questions by casting sacred coca leaves.

Cruise Lake Titicaca to Sun Island

Board a sleek vessel for a cruise across the crystal-blue waters of Lake Titicaca to arrive at Isla del Sol (Sun Island), one of the Inca's most sacred places. Walk among its many ruins and taste the waters of its sacred fountain, which legend holds can grant eternal youth.







Bogotá

Perched 8,700 feet above sea level, the Colombian capital of Bogotá sprawls across a vast plateau surrounded by the eastern range of the Andes Mountains. Bogotá was founded in 1538 by Spanish conquistador Gonzalo Jiménez de Quesada, eventually growing to boast a population of eight million. This rapidly emerging destination welcomes guests with its historic colonial architecture, thriving nightlife and superb al fresco dining scene. Bogotá also affords a convenient gateway to Colombia's diverse wealth of attractions that lie farther afield.

Coffee Triangle (Pereira)

Surrounded by the towering Andes, the World-Heritage-Listed Coffee Triangle's rich, volcanic soils and moderate climate make it Colombia's best-known coffee production region. Combining lush green valleys, exotic wildlife and a balmy climate, it is one of Colombia's most sought-after destinations — the perfect place to unwind and relax, while you sit back and sip the fresh, local coffee.

Cartagena

Cartagena's period architecture; horse-drawn carriages; and narrow, cobbled streets exude colonial charm. This Caribbean jewel was the first Spanish colony on the South American mainland and one of the main ports of the Spanish fleet, shaping it into a powerhouse trade center in the 16th century. Today, the city draws artists, writers, musicians and travellers searching for a muse.









The Galápagos

Located 600 miles off the coast of Ecuador, this pristine island paradise captivated Charles Darwin in 1835, inspiring his theory of evolution by natural selection. Thankfully, not much has changed on the islands since then. They remain home to an incredible diversity of flora and fauna found nowhere else on the planet, including the blue-footed booby and Galápagos penguin. The island's volcanic landscapes and coral seascapes beckon guests to hike among dozing iguanas and snorkel with frolicking sea lions.

Otavalo

Located in Ecuador's Imbabura Province, Otavalo is best known for its thriving market, which boasts colorful, locally made handicrafts and textiles. Activities available in and around the city include weaving demonstrations, hiking and horseback riding, and the chance to see Andean condors up close at a local reserve for rescued raptors.







The Mashpi Biodiversity Reserve, nestled in a cloud forest on the western slopes of the Andes in Ecuador, is home to 500 species of birds, countless plants and a vast array of animals, including frogs, monkeys, peccaries and pumas. The Salt Cathedral of Zipaquirá

Near the mining town of Zipaquirá, not far from Bogotá, some 650 feet underground in an abandoned salt mine, stands one of the most unique churches in the world. Featuring dramatic lighting, sculptures and the stations of the cross, it welcomes pilgrims and travellers alike.



Perched atop Cartagena's highest point, the striking Convento de La Popa looks down on the city rooftops some 500 feet below. Take in sweeping views of the bay and cityscape as you learn about the lives of the women who cloistered in this lofty 17th-century enclave.
